- Focus on 80% of students achieving an age appropriate spelling and reading age by the end of 2022.

Our initiatives include

Continue to develop a whole school approach to pedagogy using the NASoT (The New Art and Science of Teaching) framework:

- By establishing and communicating clear learning goals (Marrzano, 2019) and delivering teaching that supports student knowledge of how the progression of their learning is related to the knowledge required to complete tasks (Marrzano, 2019);
- By ensuring students are exposed to explicitly taught spelling using the C2C spelling materials aligned to the Australian Curriculum through direct instruction, multi-sensory and research-based strategies for consistency across the school. (Wood, Samantha, 2007 and C2C spelling)
- By exposing students to reading comprehension strategies through explicitly taught lessons using Teaching Reading Comprehension Strategies, Sheena Cameron, 2010.
- By developing and implementing strategies to further build teacher capabilities in the precise use of student data and identify learning gaps, inform teaching practice and communicate next steps for learning (Data Literacy framework, DOE).
